

The Greenvale Town Board met on March, 19, 2009 at the town hall at 8:00 P.M. with all members present.

Chairman Richard Moore called the meeting to order and the pledge was said. He then called on the clerk to read the February minutes. Richard Moore moved to accept the minutes and Robert Winter seconded. They were approved.

Next on the agenda was swearing in the new officers. Greg Langer was sworn in as supervisor and Barbara Swenson as treasurer.

A thank you was then given to Bernard Budia for his 12 years as supervisor.

Richard Moore moved that Robert Winter be Chairman for the next year. Greg Langer seconded. Motion approved.

Andy and Tim Collins came before the board with a proposal to do a fer farm consisting of fox. The pens would be 24x30 inches, 16 inches off the ground. They would start the operation with bred females. Dan Storlie is helping the boys with this. It would require a conditional use permit. It would require a public hearing of adjoining landowners. They would be allowed 150 animal units. The public hearing was set for April 8 at 8:00 p.m. It was later changed to April 7 because of a meeting already scheduled.

Dale Odette came before the board for a building permit. His proposal was for building

a 48' x 88' pole shed with 16½' walls and using a portion of the shed for living quarters. Bob Hegner, building inspector, was in the audience and said he would work with Dale on set backs and plans and would be at the next meeting in April.

There is 2 meetings coming up for Board attendance. March 18 is the Dakota County Townships annual meeting. March 25 is the Association of Townships Spring Short Course.

City of Northfield sent a letter about communicating with Greenvale Twp. on the south side of North Ave.

There was discussion on changing Greenvale's ordinance on the fencing law. The clerk contacted the association of townships and the attorney said, there are several options but to change an ordinance it has to be done at an annual meeting.

The old town hall was brought up and Paul Otting said it would cost \$6000 to move it 1 mile in any direction. Greg Langer said he would send out cards to residents to see if there was an interest in moving or tearing down the town hall and would try to get answers back by the May meeting. The board would like the building either moved or demolished.

Richard Moore made a comment that there is a hole forming on Rusty Kluver's road that has to be fixed.

The board instructed the clerk to advertise in the paper for gravel bids and road maintenance ~~at~~ 5,000 Ton of crushed rock to be put on the roads by June 15. Road maintenance would include grading, snow removal, and any other road repair that is needed. Bids should be in the clerk's office by April 16 at 8:00 p.m. and will be opened at the regular meeting in April.

The pay schedule was discussed and will stay the same as last year which is: \$100 per meeting, \$200 for training sessions, \$20 per hour for working. The treasurer will be \$12,000 per year and the clerk's fee is \$6,000 per year plus extra meetings attended. Bob Winter made a motion to approve this schedule and Greg Lange seconded. Approved.

Planning and zoning commission was discussed trying to decide if it should be three or five members.
